Earthroots Field School hosts 6th Annual Festival on Family Farm in Nellie Gail Ranch, Laguna Hills

Join in the Celebration of nature, music & community!

TRABUCO CANYON, CA, March 1, 2012 – Earthroots Field School is proud to host their sixth annual Festival Fundraiser on April 1, 2012 at the Levine Family Farm in Nellie Gail Ranch, Laguna Hills.

The Earthroots Festival will include a variety of fun educational activities and entertainment for children and adults alike. From nature crafts for kids, and live music by *Cram, Miller, Long & Wright* to a feast of local organic food and farm animals to pet including baby chicks, hens, goats and turtles, the fundraiser will be a highly unique Orange County event. Attendees can also expect to enjoy a decadent Chocolate Fountain, silent auction, puppet show, West African drum and dance, and slideshow of Earthroots recent adventures.

All proceeds from the family-fun afternoon event will go towards purchasing 40 acres of beautiful property in Silverado Canyon. Earthroots Field School holds classes at numerous outdoor locations, but does not have their own land. This property will become their home base: a natural living demonstration site and educational center.

Currently owned by The Wildlands Conservancy, the 40 acres of land is being sold to Earthroots at a substantial discount due to their interest in the school's mission and excellent educational track record. *"Earthroots stewardship of the land in Silverado Canyon will allow us to deepen our educational impact. Tending land is an ancient art that directly shows us how our actions can harm or heal the earth and our community,"* says Founding Director, Jodi Levine.

About Earthroots Field School

Founded in 2005, Earthroots Field School brings children, teens and families into connection with the natural world through outdoor, hands-on classes and workshops. Classes are held at several wilderness parks, wildlife sanctuaries, South Coast Farms, The Ecology Center, and local Orange County beaches. The school offers a weekly forest Kindergarten program for ages 3-6, weekly homeschool classes for ages 6-11, teen survival skills campouts for ages 12-18, weekend campouts for families, botany classes for families and adults, and summer camps. Earthroots also develops curriculum, and conducts classes & field trips for other educational institutions such as the Journey School in Aliso Viejo.
