With your help last year, 1,150 students spent time in nature (not on screens) building a sense of belonging, and learning to care for the earth with Earthroots. Your donation brought equity to outdoor education through our Ecoliteracy program at Title 1 schools, transformed families with scholarships to our weekly nature immersion programs, tended to 39-acre Big Oak Canyon, and so much more.

Our classes and programs continue to grow, however, Big Oak Canyon, our most beloved classroom, is suffering a devastating loss of mature oak trees (some over 100 years old) due to an invasive beetle infestation. Without your help many of the trees will die, affecting countless species of animals that depend on them. I am asking for your help to save our trees because caring for the forest is essential to our students' education and the health of the ecosystem.
